0.0	Highway Crosses State Border	Baja/Baja Sur border crossing at the 28th parallel. Highway Information Center. Altitude: 33 feet
3.7	Turn off to Town of Guerrero Negro	A couple kilometers west is Guerrero Negro, Mexico. Guerrero Negro Airport. In February there is a festival to celebrate gray whale calving in the bays west of Guerrero Negro, Mexico. Largest evaporation salt mine in the world. The town is named after a whaling ship called "The Black Warrior". There are amazing dunes and the El Vizcaíno Biosphere Reserve. There is a whale bone sculpture in Guerrero Negro, Mexico. Altitude: 33 feet
76.3	Village	El Vizcaíno, Mexico Village and highway turn off to Diaz Ordaz, Mexico. There are many greenhouses in this area. Altitude: 262 feet
91.0	Airfield and Famous Ranch	Rancho El Caracol Airfield and Rancho "El Caracol" which produces the famous El caracol brand of milk products. Altitude: 262 feet
141.7	Airfield	San Ignacio Airfield Altitude: 633 feet
146.0	Town of San Ignacio, Mexico	San Ignacio, Mexico. Jesuit Mission San Ignacio (est 1728). Lush date palms grow in the area. Beautiful central plaza, and village next to the eighteenth-century Jesuit mission. San Ignacio serves as the gateway to San Ignacio Lagoon, the winter time sanctuary of the Pacific Gray Whale. Altitude: 423 feet
154.9	Natural Biosphere Reserve the Vizcaino Desert	One of the most important protected areas that holds a variety of ecosystems, from desert, mangrove swamps, and mountains hosting a great number of animals species and plants. Altitude: 696 feet
167.0	Santa Lucía Village	Santa Lucía, Baja California Sur Mexico Altitude: 843 feet
182.2	Three virgins Volcano	Three virgins Volcano is an active volcano with 2,054mt high. Altitude: 1490 feet
218.4	Santa Rosalia Village	Santa Rosalia Baja California Sur, Mexico is a port town that has a ferry that connects with the State of Sonora, Mexico the city of Guaymas. In 1868 a man named Rosario Villavicencio discovers in this lands an significant copper deposit that would come to be an important development of mines by the French company called "El Boleo" who received the concession for the mineral's extraction by the former Mexican president Porfirio Díaz. Altitude: 36 feet
218.7	Santa Rosalia, BCS	Santa Rosalia, BCS is the head town of the minicipality Mulegué where one can visit the Santa Barbara temple, build by the French engineer Gustavo Eiffel. The French architectonic style has been kept for more than a 100 years so in 1985 the downtown area was declared historic monument. Altitude: 26 feet
219.4	Santa Rosalía, Baja California Sur	Santa Rosalía, Baja California Sur, México counts with tourist services as hotels, gas station, restaurants, groceries and tours. Altitude: 33 feet
233.7	San Lucas BCS	San Lucas Baja California Sur, Mexico is a small fishing village with beautiful beaches that can also offer diving trips Altitude: 26 feet
243.4	San Bruno BCS	San Bruno Baja California Sur, Mexico has a beautiful view to San Marcos Island that has a small town and an private airstrip. Altitude: 49 feet
259.9	Road Intersection	Road Intersection to Punta Chivato, where there is a private airstrip and to a beautiful inlet called "The death" Altitude: 161 feet

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280.1	Mulegue, Baja California Sur	Mulegue BCS Mexico, the name of this village is a derivation from the cochimies language "Carmaañc galexá" and means "big ravine with a white mouth" and was discovered by the Jesuit priest Juan Maria de Salvatierra in 1702. It's situated at the mouth of the Santa Rosalia river and The Sea of Cortez Altitude: 36 feet
280.8	Mulegue, Baja California Sur	Mulegue, Baja California Sur, Mexico has a lot of date palm trees, olives and fruit trees like mango, guava, oranges and figs and offers delicious gastronomic dishes. Places to visit: Santa Rosalia de Mulegue mission (1705), the Regional museum (once a jail) El gallito dunes. Altitude: 36 feet
283.5	Mulegue Airstrips	Mulegue has two dirt airstrips, a municipal public one and El Gallito airstrip thya is a privately - owned public usedirt airstrip but with better safety conditions Altitude: 33 feet
295.1	Punta San Pedro Airstrip	Punta San Pedro Airstrip, Mulegue Baja california sur Mexico. Altitude: 128 feet
301.7	Bahía de Concepción, Baja California Sur	Bahía de Concepción, Baja California Sur Mexico, The Conception Bay is one of the most spectacular places and landscapes. Numerous beaches with white sands, it's inlets protected by huge cliffs and majestic desert plants. Great place for diving, snorkeling, kayak, sailboat tours, and swimming. It's most important beaches are Punta Prieta, Punta Arena, Santispac, Eco-Mundo, La Escondida, El Burro, Requesón and Coyote. with services for mobile homes (trailer parks) and camping. 414.0	Turism in Loreto, Baja California Sur	Loreto is a pleasant destination with beautiful natural attractions, such as the Bahia de Loreto Marine Park, which consists of a group of islands that offer ideal conditions for scuba diving, fishing and nature observing. It offers every tourist service, a variety of hotels, restaurants that prepare delicious dishes, tours in the village and outside, car rentals, museums, and more. Altitude: 26 feet
418.0	Loreto International Airport MMLT	Loreto International Airport is an international airport located at Loreto, Baja California Sur, Mexico. It handles national and international air traffic for the city of Loreto. Altitude: 62 feet

It's beaches are good for swimming, camping and diving and it has an important tourist complex with a golf court, tennis courts, stores, hotels and restaurants. Altitude: 33 feet
434.9	Nacional Park Bahia de Loreto, BCS	The Nacional Park Bahia de Loreto, in Baja California Sur Mexico has an area of 206,580 hectares mostly of sea, and it's a protected area since 1996. Is a piece of paradise rich in flora species and fauna species. Altitude: 138 feet
440.4	Intersection to Puerto Escondido Baja California Sur	Puerto Escondido Baja California Sur Mexico is a harbor where tourist and private ships and yachts land. The weather is semi dry with an average temperature of 23°C. Altitude: 131 feet

487.3	Microwave tower Agua Amarga	Microwave tower bitter water. Altitude: 1073 feet
517.1	Ley federal de aguas, Baja California Sur	Fetheral law of water number 1, Baja California Sur, Mexico Altitude: 197 feet
533.9	Ciudad Insurgentes, Baja California Sur. Mexico	Ciudad Insurgentes, Baja California Sur. Mexico is the geographic capital of the Comondu county. Is mainly an agricultural town that was once named Toba honoring the second lieutenant Toba who first brought the news to Baja California Sur that Mexico had gain it's independance. Altitude: 98 feet
534.0	Intersection with highway 53	Intersection with highway 53 Baja California Sur, Mexico Altitude: 98 feet
560.5	Ciudad Constitucion, Baja California Sur	Ciudad Constitución is a town in the Mexican state of Baja California Sur. In the heart of the Santo Domingo valley and it's the seat of the municipality of Comondú. It is the fourth-largest community in the state (behind La Paz, Cabo San Lucas, and San José del Cabo). Ciudad Constitución also serves as a gateway to Magdalena Bay. Altitude: 187 feet
561.7	Ciudad Constitución, Baja California Sur.	The colonization of Valle de Santo Domingo (Valley of Santo Domingo) originated around 1940. A ranch called El Crucero (The Crossroad) was settled in a crossroad. Because of this, people started to gather around it and the population started to grow. It quickly became a commercial hub and an obligated travel stop for all the inhabitants of Valle de Santo Domingo, as well as for people going north or south the peninsula. Altitude: 174 feet
561.9	Ciudad Constitución Airport. Baja California Sur	Ciudad Constitución Airport is a small airfield located 6 km East of the central business district of Ciudad Constitución, Baja California Sur, Mexico, It's mostly used as a general aviation airport. Altitude: 174 feet

CIBNOR conducts studies of the Gulf of California ecosystem (also known as the Sea of Cortez) which is one of the most bio-diverse bodies of water in the world. Altitude: 13 feet
761.3	El Zacatal Baja California Sur	El Zacatal Baja California Sur, Mexico Altitude: 13 feet
762.2	Road Intersection to The Airport. La Paz Baja California Sur	Manuel Márquez de León International Airport is an international airport located at La Paz, Baja California Sur, Mexico. It handles national and international air traffic of the city of La Paz. Altitude: 7 feet
765.4	Intersection with Blvd. Agustin Olachea to La Paz	La Paz (Spanish for The Peace) is the capital of the Mexican state of Baja California Sur and an important regional commercial center. Altitude: 7 feet
767.2	La Paz, Baja California Sur, Mexico	In 1597 the Admiral Sebastián Vizcaíno landed here naming this harbor after Our Lady of Peace. The principal economical activity in this city is Tourism so it's tourist infrastructure is very complete. There are beautiful beaches, landscapes, islands, a great variety of hotels, trailer parks, restaurants and shops. Altitude: 52 feet
768.8	La Paz, BCS Mexico	The city of the Peace (La Paz), Baja California Sur Mexico offers a great variety for tourist attractions, from trekking to diving, night clubs and family oriented places. Places to visit: the city hall (actually is a museum and library), The cultural section "Jesús Castro Agúndez", San Antonio de Padua's Church, Our Lady of peace Cathedral. Altitude: 75 feet
